Principal's Report

This week we have seen a significant amount of work completed in our Year 3 /4 teams as they prepare to head to camp next week. A huge thanks to Mr Dupuy and Mr Kirkright, who have led much of this work, and I know he is very much looking forward to finishing up all the administration requirements and then, on Monday, finally starting to enjoy the camp with all the students. School camps are an excellent way for students and staff to learn together and connect and continue to build relationships with each other outside of the traditional classroom setting. Most importantly, beyond just having fun and trying out new things, it is an opportunity for students to develop their independence, all whilst creating memories that I am sure they will share with you once they arrive home. Just a reminder: if your child is not attending camp, you are still required to attend school as usual, as these continue to be 'normal' school days where attendance is required. Arrangements have been made for these students to learn in other classes around the school, as all of our Year 3 /4 teachers will attend the camp with students.

This week, our staff have started preparing for the upcoming student-led conference, which will take place on Wednesday 18th September. The booking system is now open, and we encourage you to get onto Compass and secure the times that will suit your family. This is a very positive experience for the students as they will take the lead in sharing about their learning. If you have any queries concerning a child's learning, please use this time to speak with your teachers. If you require more time, I encourage you to arrange with the teachers for some additional time, which may be over the phone or at an alternative time. During the conferences, the teachers will also have a list of any 'unexplained' absences. As I have communicated in several previous newsletters, the Department of Education significantly focuses on attendance. We understand that sometimes your child cannot come to school, but we must ensure that these absences (full-day or partial) are coded accurately. We hope these 'unexplained' absences can be accounted for, which will then help them become 'explained' absences.

This week, the Department of Education informed us that it has updated policies related to the use of digital technology in schools. The Digital Learning Policy consolidates content from the previous Digital Learning in Schools and Cyber-safety and Responsible Use of Digital Technologies policies. Under the policy, schools no longer need to develop or maintain a local Digital Learning (Internet, Social Media, and Digital Devices) policy.

Instead, schools must:

- Develop an Acceptable Use Agreement (AUA) that outlines student behavioural expectations for the safe, intentional and responsible use of digital technologies. This will provide students, where appropriate, with an opportunity to agree to uphold these expectations.
- Communicate behavioural expectations to students. Once this is complete, we publish it on our school website so all our families can access it to ensure a greater understanding and build an agreed-upon expectation.

Essential requirements include:

- Active supervision of students whilst engaged with device use / digital learning
- Ensure that any use of technology has an appropriate educational purpose and mitigates privacy and child safety risks.

The main update is that content from the previous Social Media Use to Support Student Learning and Cybersafety policies, and the Responsible Use of Digital Technologies policies has been consolidated. The timeline to complete the above is when you are next due to review your local Digital Learning policy, which for WPS is 2026; however, we may opt to complete this earlier (if required). Mr Wilson, our STEM and Digital Learning leaders, will continue to work in this area and ensure that we do all we can as a school to ensure that all our students are safe using devices.

Lastly, if your team is involved in the AFL or local NFNL finals, I wish you all the best and good luck to your respective teams. Regardless of who you follow, I am sure everyone will be treated to a great round of sport.








