

# **Principal's Report**



### Welcome back to Term 4!

This week, seeing the students return to school enthusiastic and ready to learn was great. Their active participation in lessons and eagerness to reconnect with teachers and classmates are testaments to their positive attitudes towards Whittlesea Primary School.

The staff have been involved in professional learning, which was associated with our recent school survey results. At our forum, we looked at our School Staff survey and preliminary results from the Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey. I sincerely thank the 21% of our families who took the time to complete the survey and provide us with valuable information and feedback. This is an excellent outcome compared to other schools I have worked in. Some key highlights from the Staff option survey were that in all our core modules, the 2024 results have increased since the 2023 results. I was extremely pleased that this was the case, considering the significant change that has taken place with staffing. School Climate 62% (2023) to 67% (2024), Teaching & Learning 72% (2023) to 84% (2024) and School leadership 76% (2023) to 82% (2024). Whilst the 'titles' seem self-explanatory, they are often tricky to unpack as a series of 'domain' questions calculate the percentages. Regardless of all this, it is very pleasing to see these trending positively.

Regarding the Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey, we will continue to unpack these and look at the improvement opportunities. Some of the highlights I feel proud to share with you are the following:

- The school gives my child opportunities to participate in school activities: 93%
- Physical environment: 87%
- Teachers at this school expect my child to do their best: 87%
- Getting information that I need through the school's regular communication: 85%
- The School cares about my child's safety 84%
- The School cares about my child's wellbeing 82%
- High Expectations for Success: 80%
- Opportunities for my child to develop a sense of responsibility: 80%
- School connectedness: 80%

On Wednesday evening, Mr Hugh Wilson, our STEM teacher and Digital Learning Leader, along with a representative from 'Edunet', presented to many of our Year 2 families regarding the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) evening. This session covered all the details regarding the devices available, warranties, ordering, delivery, e-safety, and the portal. Please refer to the school website for more information, including the portal access. Hugh also facilitated a Q&A at the end of the evening, which I know the families who attended found very worthwhile. If you could not attend this evening, the presentation is also on the school website and posted via Compass.







Regarding e-Safety, I am pleased to announce that the school will partner with Inform and Empower in 2025. This is a digital safety and wellbeing program, facilitated by presenters with a wealth of knowledge and experience, including a former primary school teacher and a child psychologist. This is a "real-world" educational approach to all cyber safety matters. It presents the information in a relevant and current format, with practical examples of educating children. The Inform and Empower program is informative and empowering for ALL stakeholders—students, staff, and parents/carers. This program will provide essential information about staying safe online and protecting our most important asset—our children! This program has many aspects: live incursions for students, cyber safety videos and curriculum, and parent information fact sheets.

We are continuing to finalise our staffing profile for 2025. I am delighted to announce that Ms Karen White is joining our team. Karen will be a very experienced teacher who has a passion for Literacy and is looking forward to joining our team next year. In addition to this, I would like to say congratulations to the following WPS staff who have been appointed to the following school positions for next year:

- Mr. Brad Dupuy Substantive Learning Specialist
- Ms Zoe Dyer Graduate Teacher Position
- Ms Kate Storck Graduate Teacher Position

Lastly, this week, we received confirmation of the demolition of the old toilet block. This is to be completed by the Victorian Schools Building Authority (VSBA). This has been something that we have been waiting for ever since the installation of the new toilet block. Whilst we do not have a definitive timeline at this stage, the fact that the removal is fully funded by the VSBA is very motive news. Regarding what we will do with this 'new' space once the old block is gone, it is a 'watch this space'.





I hope the Year 5 and 6 students and staff who are attending camp next week have a wonderful time and cannot wait to hear about their adventures.



# A Message from the Department of Education: Social Media Safety

Families play an important role in supporting their children to be safe online and on social media. You can help your children safely navigate their digital world and educate them to avoid harmful online experiences. You can explore websites, games, apps and social media together and set some rules and boundaries. Your support and guidance can give your children the knowledge to make sound decisions online and the confidence to ask for help when needed. It is also essential to stay informed about online safety.

The Department of Education acknowledges the significance of this issue and has developed fact sheets to provide support in keeping students safe online and guiding them in case of an online incident. The fact sheets contain links to evidence-based information on supporting positive and safe online experiences, signs a child or young person might need support, what to do if something unsafe happens online, and where to reach out for more support. This group is for parents that are concerned about their child's anxiety that would like to learn strategies they can put in place to support the wellbeing of their child and the family.
