Principal's Team Report

It has been a wonderful second week of the term as students have settled into their new classes, with new class friends and in many cases new teachers. We have been focussing on ensuring that everyone is connected to the school and that our 19 classes understand our consistent expectations It has been very pleasing to see how our Foundation students have continued to learn new knowledge and routines with lots of enthusiasm for learning and general 'school life'.

Today we commenced our Interschool sports competition with our Year 5 and 6 students very keen to compete in the sports of Tee ball, Basketball, and Cricket. We were very proud as we visited the various venues to see teamwork and good sports etiquette being displayed. Please refer to the sports school of this Primary Post to see your results. Win, Lose, or draw, the main thing that is everyone had fun working in teams, and we got to be outdoors and exercising!





Our teachers and students are establishing class routines and showing our school expectations. Our class time is very precious, and we need to ensure that all students have time and space to do their 'best' learning. Teachers are learners as well and this week, as a school we undertook some professional learning on the Google Education Suite. This Google Workspace offers multiple options that will meet both our school's collaboration and communication needs. It provides a range of tools to enhance teaching and learning, such as Google Classroom, Google Meet, Google Docs, and Google Forms. For our students in Years 3 – 6, it will mean that we will slowly transition from Microsoft Teams to a Google Classroom platform. This is a free blended learning platform that aims to simplify creating, distributing, and marking assignments. The main benefit is that it streamlines the process of sharing files between teachers and students.

Over the weekend the mulch around all our playgrounds will be 'topped up' to ensure that they are compliant in terms of both depth and soft fall regulations. The playgrounds are enjoyed by a wide range of students from all year levels. These spaces promote and develop crucial physical, social, emotional, and imaginative skills that are necessary to gain self-confidence, improve coordination, and advance their critical thinking capabilities.

Lastly, as we are expected to have some warm weather throughout next week, it is a timely reminder that all students wear their Whittlesea Primary School SunSmart hats and have their water bottles to sip on throughout the day.

The Beautiful Imperfection of Parenting

I love being a parent. I love it with every part of my being and more than I ever thought I could love anything. Honestly though, nothing has brought out my insecurities or vulnerabilities as much. This is so normal. Confusing, and normal.

We have to lovingly make way for the duality of parenting. It's joyful and lonely. It nourishes and depletes. It's tender and maddening. We discover the richest, most luminescent parts of ourselves, while we feel other parts go missing for a while.

We are selfless, loving, and nurturing. And sometimes we aren't. It was never meant to be about perfection. It's about love, and love is never perfect. It's honest, raw, pure. It's irrational and infuriating. It's beautiful, life-giving, and imperfect. So are we. So are our children. Let's no give them a ridiculous ideal to live up to by expecting ourselves or our parenting to be otherwise.

However many children we have, and whatever age they are, each child and each new stage will bring something new for us to learn. It will always be this way. Our children will each do life differently, and along the way we will need to adapt and bend ourselves around their path to light their way as best we can. But we won't do this perfectly, because we can't always know what mountains they'll need to climb, or what dragons they'll need to slay. We won't always know what they'll need, and we won't always be able to give it. We don't need to. But we'll want to. Sometimes we'll ache because of this and we'll blame ourselves for not being 'enough'. Sometimes we won't.

This is the vulnerability that comes with parenting.

We love them so much, and that never changes, but the way we feel about parenting might change a thousand times before breakfast. Parenting is tough. It's worth every second – every second – but it's tough. Great parents can feel everything, and sometimes it can turn from moment to moment – loving, furious, resentful, compassionate, gentle, tough, joyful, selfish, confused and wise – all of it. Great parents can feel all of it. Because parenting is pure joy, but not always. We are strong, nurturing, selfless, loving, but not always. Parents aren't perfect. Love isn't perfect. And it was meant to be. We're raising humans – real ones, with feelings, who don't need to be perfect, and wont need others to be perfect. Humans who can be kind to others, and to themselves first. But they will learn this from us.

Parenting is the role which needs us to be our most human, beautifully imperfect, flawed, vulnerable selves. Let's not judge ourselves for our shortcomings and the imperfections, and the necessary human-ness of us.

We cant wait to see you all back for another super fun Term with you all and cant not wait to meet the new families and Preps starting this year.


