

Welcome back to Term 2.

This week it was wonderful to see so many of our families engaging with their children's teachers at our Parent Teacher Student Conferences. As our progressive reports were posted at the end of last term, these conferences were an opportunity to have 'deeper' discussions about each student's learning and educational outcomes. On the progressive reports, you would have noticed that we have paid particular attention to learning dispositions. Learner dispositions are very important as they have an impact on a child's overall ability to learn and progress. Dispositions develop alongside and in conjunction with children's acquisition of knowledge, skills, attitudes, and understanding. Research has told us that when students have the disposition of what it is to be a 'learner', it builds the foundation for students to be lifelong learners and take more risks in their learning. It is interesting when we speak with students about what makes a good learner that often they talk about 'someone who gets all the answers correct', but in fact, a good learner is someone who Stays curious and open-minded and is receptive to new ideas, perspectives, and experiences. Good learners explore new topics and subjects and are willing to challenge assumptions and beliefs, ask questions, seek answers, and never stop learning.

We have continued to make improvements around the school and this week the classes on the northern side of the Early Learning Centre were very pleased to see the installation of reverse cycle air conditioning and heating. This has brought much excitement to Ms. Stork and Ms. Fontana's classes. I have even heard that these new units are being named so I am very much looking forward to hearing what they will be referred to. Over the holiday break, we also continue to do some work around the yard. As posted on our school Facebook page we have restored the stairs from our mid-level up to the basketball court and A block. They are not quite finished yet as an additional safety rail is still to be installed to ensure that students traveling up and down these stairs are doing so in a safe manner. Also in the holiday, the school has been completely sprayed, and as many spider webs as we could see were removed. It has been communicated to many that many little 'spider families' were not very happy with the spraying and quickly wanted to relocate. This was long overdue, and I know I feel much better knowing that many of these 'little crawling friends' are no longer calling WPS home.

This week I had a student forum with our Year 6 leaders. The research tells us that when students have a voice at school they are three times more likely to experience self-worth, five times more likely to experience engagement, and five times more likely to experience purpose in school. These students were fantastic and gave me so much input, feedback, and suggestions. We will be working with all our Year 6 students and their teachers which will help us have some special events and activities. These will be planned and communicated as soon as finalised.

Last term, it was observed that in some of our classes, we do have some students who are not showing our school-expected behaviours — Respect Your School, Do Your Best and Help Others Succeed. On behalf of our school, we will be looking at some adjustments to how these are reinforced in our classrooms. As we know, all actions have consequences, whether these are positive or negative consequences, based on positive or negative actions. We are currently in the process of developing our *Consequence Continuum*. This will be a visual reminder of when students do not show our expected behaviour and how each student may (or may not) move along the continuum. As a school, we are trying to explicitly teach and show that when we have respectful interactions with teachers and peers, it enables a more positive and productive learning environment. When this is not able to occur due to the actions or behaviour of some, then there should be appropriate consequences in place. This is not punishment or retribution, but more a way of regulating, being restorative, and resetting what it means to be a positive contributor to a Whittlesea Primary School classroom and yard.

Lastly, our new Toilet Block installation which was planned for Friday of next week, has now had to be rescheduled. Vic Roads has communicated with the Victorian School Building Authority, that there are regulations prohibiting the transportation of heavy loads on the day following public holidays. Whilst this is a little disappointing, it does give us some extra time to relocate as many of our indigenous plants and garden features as we can. We are hoping to maintain our archway and some of the front features of the garden, but these will also be managed by the team from the building authority as to what can stay and what we will have to move.

#### Hello Everyone

Wednesday's adjusted day provided the perfect opportunity for students, parents and carers to get a progress update from teachers. These interviews are particularly important as they provide feedback on key learner dispositions and student learning goals for the remainder of the term.

This year, Whittlesea Primary School will once again, proudly support the ANZAC Day Appeal.

Our Year 6 leaders are selling badges before and after school and during first break next week in the lead up to ANZAC Day. You will find them in front of the Heritage building near the soccer pitch.

On Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April, Whittlesea Primary School will join with the broader Whittlesea community at the ANZAC Day march to the Arch memorial and soldier's memorial. If you would like your child to march with the school, please consent to the Compass Event and meet at the Whittlesea Bowling Club, Church Street at 2:00PM. Step off will commence at 2:30PM. If your child is being collected by another parent or walking home at the end of the march, please see me on the day and provide written permission. Parents/carers are invited to walk with their children.

We are excited to announce that this year School Council has approved a Mother's Day stall. A variety of items will be available for students to choose from, and the cost is \$5.00. The event is now available to view on Compass. The stall will be held on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> May and a catch up will be held on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May for students absent on Thursday. The school will raise a small amount of money from this event, and it will be used in conjunction with the colour run money to repurpose the area behind the cubbies near the staff carpark.

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May, from 3:15PM – 4:00PM, our staff will host a Mother's Day/Special Person afternoon tea in the gym. We hope to see you there!



The Whole School Athletics event, originally scheduled for Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April, has been rescheduled for Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May. Planning is well underway, and the event will look very similar to previous years with more information to be shared including a Compass event (consent and bus cost) and invitations for parent helpers in the coming weeks.

There are multiple factors that have led to this event being rescheduled. As many of you are aware, our new toilet block will be arriving shortly. We had hoped to schedule its installation on the day of the athletics next week when there are no students and staff onsite. Unfortunately, due to the public holiday on Thursday, Vic Roads prohibit the haulage of such large buildings on Victorian roads. We are liaising with the relevant authorities to align the delivery with the Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May. The rescheduled date will also give the incoming PE teacher an opportunity to be involved in this whole school event.


